**Do I know God and does

Yada: Hebrew (Strong's H3045)

Found about 946 times in the Hebrew Old Testament. A subjective dimension of knowing, not just objective.

Ginóskó: Greek (Strong's G1097)

Much more an intellectual looking at and connotes objectivity.

(The Greeks did not have a word that properly translated the full meaning of Yada)

There are 2 sides of Yada!

**1) Us experiencing
(knowing) God!**

Jeremiah 9:23-24

²³ This is what the Lord says:

“Let not the wise boast of their wisdom
or the strong boast of their strength
or the rich boast of their riches,

²⁴ **but let the one who boasts boast about this:
that they have the understanding to know (yada) me,**
that I am the Lord, who exercises kindness,
justice and righteousness on earth,
for in these I delight,”
declares the Lord.

Yada:

To perceive, know, find out, know by experience, know a person by experience, to have experience, to take care of someone, (to know someone sexually as in marriage)

At the core, Yada (and Ginóskó) mean “knowledge gained through experience” or experiential knowledge.

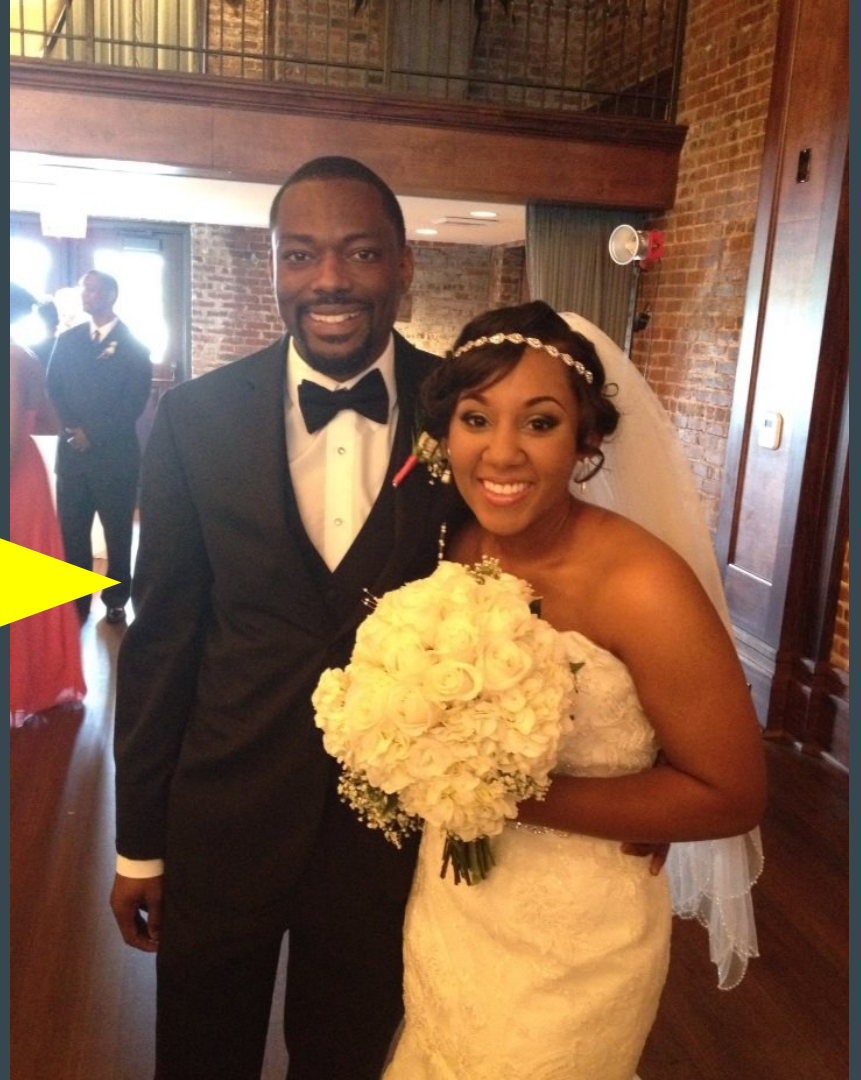

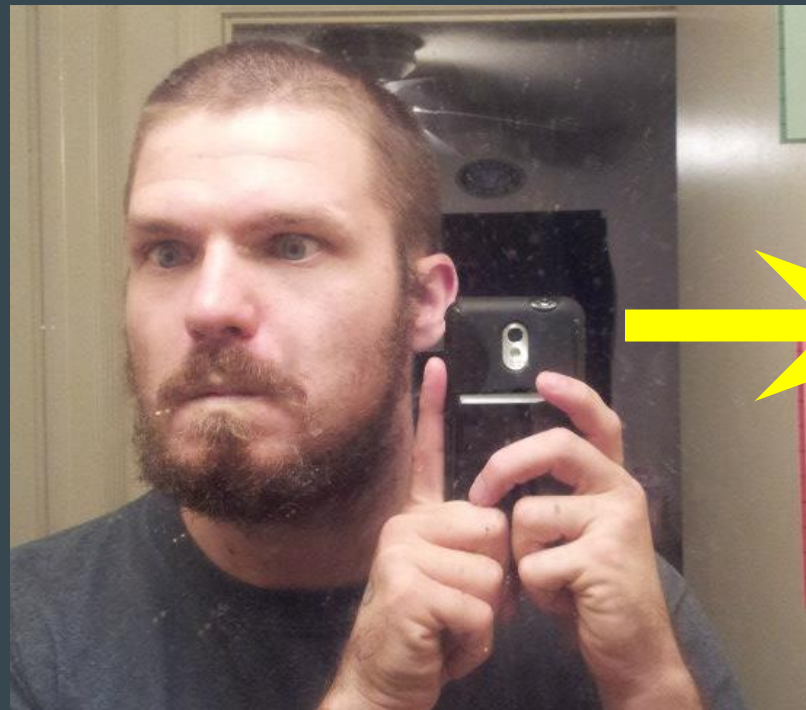

Do Not Forget the Lord

Be careful to follow every command I am giving you today, so that you may live and increase and may enter and possess the land the Lord promised on oath to your ancestors. ² Remember how the Lord your God led you all the way in the wilderness these forty years, to humble and test you in order to **know (yada)** what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commands.

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Surely God knows me already, right?

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Surely God knows me already, right?

Yes, but not experientially! (He wants to know you through experience - this is the difference between intellect and heart!)

Some of the ways that God wants to know us by experiencing our character:

- Obedience to Him
- Fear of Him
- Belief and Faith in Him (even through hard times)
- Service to Him and like His son, Jesus
- Confession of our sin's
- Knowledge of Him

Knowing God means that we are experiencing His character and He is experiencing our character through our obedience to Him.

It's a two way relationship!



John 8:31-32

³¹ To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, “If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. ³² Then you will know (ginóskó) the truth, and the truth will set you free.”

John 8:31-32

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This is an experiential knowledge of the truth, not just intellectual!

By holding to the teachings of Jesus (scripture) we open the door to God being in a relationship with us (knowing us) and we get to experience the truth (not just intellectual knowledge but heart as well) that leads to freedom!

Jesus Prays to Be Glorified

After Jesus said this, he looked toward heaven and prayed:

“Father, the hour has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you.

² For you granted him authority over all people that he might give eternal life to all those you have given him. ³ Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.

- **Are you experiencing Yada?**
- **Are you experiencing God and is God experiencing you?**
